# **Assembly Event Summary**

In our recent meetings we received communications from our Supreme and State Knights of Columbus Officers. Hispanic Heritage Month (Sept. 15-Oct.15) where we recognize in a special way the contributions of our Hispanic Brother Knights (our Membresia En Los Caballeros De Colon). I recently received my current copy of COLUMBIA MAGAZINE and I hope you did too. On page 20, you will see Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly reconsecrating OUR ORDER, to Our Lady of Guadalupe at HER basilica in Mexico City. Past Supreme Knight, Carl Anderson, who originally consecrated our order to Santa Maria de Guadalupe 22 years ago and Archbishop William Lori are also shown. We received a most recent communication at our meeting, of a PATRIOTIC presentation, attended by some, at MARY OUR QUEEN in Peachtree City. Dr David Gilbert (Clayton State University and a Brother Knight) provided in depth understanding of our history of Caballeros De Colon, the "Joan of Arcs" that smuggled ammunition under their skirts to their battles against the EVIL, and the many MEXICAN MARTYRS and Saints we honor today, from the CRISTERO WARS. A presentation Brother David is willing to provide at other venues (preferably ones with video screens). VIVA CRISTO REY ((Long Live Christ the King).

### ST ALPHONSA SYRO-MALABAR FORANE CATHOLIC CHURCH

Attending Sunday HOLY MASS (the HOLY QURBANA at 11 AM in English). In 2001, St THOMAS Syro-Malabar Catholic Church became a parish under St Thomas Syro-Malabar Diocese of Chicago, established in full communion with the "Roman See" by Pope John Paul II. Malabar is named from the South India coastal region known as Malabar during the ancient times of St Thomas the Apostle. Blessed Alphonsa mission came into existence in 2003 on Rosebud Road 4 miles South of St Oliiver's location. With financial and extensive assistance from the Knanaya Catholic community in Atlanta, the Church was built and consecrated in December 2006. Saint Alphonsa Parish has become such an important center for Syro-Malabar Catholics in the South-East that it was elevated to a Forane Church in 2014. A Vicar Forane can be appointed by a Bishop of a Diocese to assist in a region not near the Bishop's house. In the United States such a region is called a "Deanery". St Alphonsa is the only parish in the entire Syro-Malabar Church with an active KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS COUNCIL, # 13450 under DD-23. While St Thomas Council is listed with St Michael the Archangel Assembly #3410, their approximately 10 active/inactive 4th Degree Sir Knights are largely on the rolls of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Assembly # 2475, Lilburn, Georgia. Grand Knight Jose Kannukkadan gave us a very warm and gracious welcome. The St Thomas Council is also looking forward to introducing a new Syro-Malabar mission in the Cumming, Georgia area and its participation in the Knights of Columbus.

Here's the day-of info that you may need:

- Date: Saturday, November 4, 2023.
- <u>Time</u>: arrive by 8:30 am, Climb begins at 9:00 am. (most Teams take about 3 hours to complete the 5.8 mile trail)
- Where: Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park, 900 Kennesaw Mountain Drive, Kennesaw, GA 30152. Start at the Visitor Center (Trail map enclosed).
- What to wear: comfortable clothes and sturdy shoes for climbing trails and rocks. Challenge the
  past 2 years had good, cool, dry weather, but dress appropriately. You may wear Knights
  outerwear, and perhaps your name badge so we know everyone's name.
- <u>Parking</u>: \$5 fee per car. Go online at <a href="https://www.nps.gov/kemo/planyourvisit/fees.htm">https://www.nps.gov/kemo/planyourvisit/fees.htm</a> to purchase a permit for Nov. 4<sup>th</sup> beforehand, or pay it when you get there in the morning. There are 2 parking lots: smaller lot at the Visitor Center, larger lot just down Old 41 Highway (3 minute walk). See the enclosed form.
- What we provide: 40 lb. Cross (most of you have it already!), shoulder towels, 2 pairs of gloves, and 2 backpacks to carry supplies (small medical pack, emergency whistle, water, Gatorade, snacks, copies of the Northern trail maps, etc.)
- Food: we'll have lunch and drinks for all Team members when you come back to the Visitor Center.
- The Donations: the Challenge website will close by Nov. 10<sup>th</sup>. Last year, with the \$10,000 collected, we were able to send \$500 checks to 20 Seminarians....we're hoping to do even better this year!
